Decorative Bib

1. Print out pattern. Overlap the pages to get the full pattern. One pattern is for around the neck (Decorative Bib) and the other pattern is a short version of an apron (Decorative Apron Bib).











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- 2. For the **Decorative Bib** You can do a crazy patch design or use a novelty print. Use muslin or a light weight fabric to place your pieces of fabric on if you are doing a crazy quilt piecing. These designs allow for the spills to not show. I used a novelty fabric on the back as well. This way you can reverse the bib until you are ready to wash it. Use your decorative stitches on your machine for the crazy patch pieces and the strap if you like. It makes is more decorative.
- 3. **For the Decorative Apron Bib** The strap for the apron bib is 24 inches long by 3 inches. I folded the sides in lengthwise to the center then pressed it together to complete the strap. Then use a running stitch to assemble it together. The finished width of the strap is 1 inch. Place the strap between the back and front before you sew around the sides. Leave an opening for turning. Then use a straight stitch or decorative to go around the entire bib.
- 5. I used magnetic closures at the end of the tabs. They sew on like buttons. You can use velcro, but the magnets which I purchased for bracelets are really strong and I think they hold better than velcro.
- 6. Make a case out matching fabric to keep the bib in for your purse. I did this one in the embroidery hoop, but if you don't have an embroidery machine, you can do this easily on a regular sewing machine. Cut 2 pieces of fabric 30 inches long by 7 inches wide. Cut a piece of light weight batting 30 inches long. Place front material (right side up), then batting, and then inside fabric (right side up). Stitch up the sides, leaving an opening for turning. Fold up bottom of fabric about 6 inches to make the pouch and stitch. You can then turn it inside out so your stitching doesn't show. You can monogram your name or initials on the flap for an additional flare. I used a velcro piece on the flap for a closure.








Decorative Bib 1b
